The aim of the activity	Recognising the famous Bursa knife.
Places where the event can be held	Classroom, Bursa City Museum
Age group for the activity	10

A. BEFORE OUT-OF-SCHOOL LEARNING ACTIVITY	
Educational tools	Computer,smart board, PowerPoint presentation, video
Method, technique and strategies	Question-answer, presentation, observation trip
PRACTICE	
Introduction of the activity	Students will be able to learn about the famous Bursa knife.
Development of the activity	The teacher shows a presentation about the historical development of the knife to the students and takes their ideas about how the knife has changed from the past to the present.
Evaluation of the activity	At the end of the in-class activity, the teacher asks the students about the changes in knives from past to present and listens to the answers of the students.

Educational tools	Camera
Method, technique and strategies	Observation, Question-Answer,

Introduction of the activity	Students will be able to know Bursa Knife.
Development of the activity	A trip to Bursa City Museum is organised with the students. Students are asked to take photos of the knives they like in the museum.
Evaluation of the activity	The students are asked which stages Bursa Knife has gone through from the past to the present and what changes it has undergone.

C. AFTER OUT OF SCHOOL LEARNING ACTIVITY

Educational tools	Play dough
Method, technique and strategies	Question and answer, learning by doing
PRACTICE	
Introduction of the activity	Demonstration of the development of Bursa Knife from past to present.
Development of the activity	The students are asked to make samples of the Bursa knives they saw in the museum from the play dough.

Evaluation of the activity	<p>Students are asked to exhibit the knife models they have made and a question and answer activity is carried out about the development of the knife from past to present through the knife samples they exhibit.</p> <p>What were knives made of in the past?</p> <p>What are knives made of today?</p> <p>What were the knife models in the past?</p> <p>What are today's knife models?</p> <p>What are the differences between the knives of the past and the knives of today?</p> <p>Which knife in the museum did you like the most? Why?</p> <p>What kind of knife would you design?</p>
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
